

Equestrian Campground Rules and Regulations

- Reservations are required. Check-in: 1:00 PM; check-out: 11:00AM.
- Quiet hours are from 9:00 PM-8:00 AM; however, camping courtesy is in effect 24 hours a day – no loud music or profanity/abusive language will be tolerated.
- Owners are responsible for the care, control, and behavior of their horses at all times. Owners assume full responsibility for damage caused by their equine, pets, and/or equipment.
- Equine must be up to date on all required vaccinations, including a current negative Coggins test (must be made available on request). No sick or injured equine are permitted; equine showing signs of illness will be asked to leave immediately.
- Use processed or certified weed-free feed to prevent the introduction of invasive or non-native plant species. Unprocessed hay may contain viable seeds that can establish, spread, and outcompete native vegetation, resulting in habitat degradation.
- Equine must not be left unattended.
- No free riding is permitted in the campground. Riding is limited to and from the trails only. Walk horses through campground areas. No riding through campsites after dark.
- A maximum of six guests and one horse/equine per site is permitted: one horse trailer and one tent.
- No more than two vehicles per site. Additional vehicles must be parked in the overflow section. Overflow parking tags are required and may be obtained from park staff. Vehicles left overnight without a tag are subject to towing at owners' expense.
- To help maintain stall/corral floors, shavings are required. Stalls/corrals must be cleaned daily, and at departure, and waste disposed of in designated area.
- Manure dump area is for manure only, no household garbage, please!

- You may rinse or cool down your equine within the campground, but please do not wash your equine, tack, etc.
- Only provided stalls/corrals and mounting stations may be used to tie equine; please do not tie equine to trees or natural surroundings.
- Please do not block roadways or trails with vehicles or trailers.
- Store grain and feed in sealed containers to prevent wildlife access.
- Pets must always be on a leash no longer than six feet in length and never left unattended. Pets are not permitted inside in any LRCP buildings, including restrooms.
- Fires are permitted in fire pits only. Do not leave fires unattended. Fully extinguish fires before departure. Please do not bring your own firewood as this transports tree-killing pests. Firewood is available for purchase at the Environmental Discovery Center.
- State law prohibits draining of grey water onto the ground. Please use designated dump station (located in the Family Campground) to empty all wastewater tanks.
- Do not move picnic tables or fire pits.
- Camping is limited to 14 nights.
- The possession and/or consumption of alcoholic beverages is prohibited throughout the park.
- Uneven surfaces, potentially hazardous wildlife, and weather extremes are part of the natural environment. Be prepared and stay aware! You may encounter different types of nature in our park, including insects and changes of weather. Refunds are not issued for early departures.
